Coles Sports for Schools



Instrumental Music News

During Week 9 all students in the Instrumental Music Program were invited to attend performance workshops at the Brolga Theatre. The band played on Tuesday and Wednesday and the string orchestras on Thursday and Friday. The band played a number of popular tunes including Ozzie's Mozzie and other tunes from their tutor book and were assisted by renowned percussionist Chris Scott who attended from Brisbane. There was a strong focus on tone production especially in the lower brass and rhythmic clarity.

On the non-beginner strings day the students were divided into two orchestras to better manage the large number of attendees. Orchestra one played songs including Jamaican Spice and When the Strings Go Marching In. Orchestra Two played songs including High Sea Adventures and Dragon Fire. They were tutored by Maree Macaskill.

All groups participated in body percussion workshops to help develop their sense of group pulse and rhythm. It was a big day for all, and an important experience for students to play in the beautiful Brolga Theatre. The Brolga Theatre has the best acoustics for a regional theatre in Australia and remains the musical heart of Maryborough. It was a great opportunity for the students to come together to perform for each other and work as a team.

Dear Parents/Carers,

Our Inter House Athletics Carnival this year will take place over three days. The dates & times are as follows:

Ballgames	27 June 2018	Wednesday	1:30 – 3:00

A program accompanies this letter detailing the time of events on these days. So as to ensure these days run smoothly and your child is prepared for participation, please note the following details:

When students arrive to school on these days they are to gather under Admin block as per usual before first going to their class to have the rolls marked.

On Wednesday & Thursday students are to wear their normal black/gold uniform.

On Friday, we encourage students to wear their house colours

House colours are Bidwill = red; Petrie=blue; Wilson=green; Julius=white

On Friday only, students may also colour their hair and/or wear coloured zinc if they wish

Students must wear a broad brimmed hat & bring a water bottle

Students must wear their shoes to school on these days

We strongly recommend students bring sun screen

FOOD

The school tuckshop will operate on Friday for students. Normal menu applies. Please pre-order your child's lunch and afternoon tea on Thursday so that the food is prepared in plenty of time for Friday. This will assist in ensuring students do not miss any events due to delays at the tuckshop.

All students will be brought up to eat outside the Admin block at lunch time. If you wish your child to remain with you on the oval for lunch let their classroom teacher know.

The P & C will have a BBQ food stall available for spectators on the oval on Friday. Pre-orders are not required for this food stall. This will run all day and will provide:

Throughout the Athletic Carnival days, students will be gathered in the House tents when not competing. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

After Presentations on Friday, children may go home prior to 3:00pm with parents if you so wish. Please be sure to tell your child's teacher if you are taking him or her home with you early. We are unable to send students home earlier than 3:00pm by themselves. Normal school bus schedules run on the day.
