This funding will be used to

- Assist our case management strategies aimed at improving and maintining the number of students receiving an A-C achievement in English. (2022 AIP Target: 84%).
- Ensure all students have the opportunity to engage in repeated, one hour blocks of focus differentiated learning for reading and writing, aligned to the Australian Curriculum and English units of work.
- Support our strategy, based on disaggregated data, to improve outcomes for Indigenous students,
 Children in Care and students with disability.

Our initiatives include

- Employment of a HOD: Curriculum to lead the planning and moderation process, and to further develop staff pedagogical and data literacy skills for the focus area of English.
- Staff will be be involved in planning, moderation, curriculum check-ins, data conversations and CASW (Collaborative Assessment of Student Work).
- Provide ongoing professional development and opportunities for collaborative planning to enhance the pedagogical practices of all staff.
- Purchase additional teacher aide time to provide a quality, differentiated delivery of English (reading and writing) across all year levels. This will be prioritised to 1 hour literacy blocks in each classroom from Prep to Year 6, several times a week.
- Additional teacher aide time will also be used to implement targeted intervention, including speech and language intervention.
